DISCHARGE SUMMARY

DIAGNOSIS:
Scalp burn.

OPERATIVE PROCEDURE:
None.

HISTORY:

This 25 year old male pop singer sustained a burn to the apex of the scalp as result of an accident which occurred approximately 6:15 p.m. at the Shrine Auditorium during filming of a Pepsi-Cola commercial. He states that while performing the commercial, a timing error occurred and a pyrotechnic device exploded behind his head. His hair caught on fire and he was smothered by his brothers and stage crew and the fire put out. He was initially transported to Cedars-Sinai Hospital. Prior to transportation, I was asked by the family to care for the patient. At Cedars-Sinai Hospital, he was noted to be quite shaken up with palm-sized area of 2nd and small area of 3rd degree burn with surrounding burned and singed hair. Chest x-ray done at that institution was unremarkable. He was provided oral analgesia (Darvocet-N), transported to Brotman Medical Center Burn Unit. He was placed on warm blankets. His vital signs were noted to be normal. He was less than anxious and fearful from the incident. He was hospitalized for control of moderate to severe pain.

PAST MEDICAL HISTORY: Allergies: None. Medications: Plaquenil 200 mg bid and Atabrine 100 mg qd. Previous operative procedure: Nasal surgery.

REVIEW OF SYSTEMS: HEENT: Denies any decreased visual or auditory acuity problems. CARDIORESPIRATORY: No cough, sputum production, angina, wheezing or palpitations. GI: No nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or constipation. GU: No obstructive bleeding or infectious symptoms.

SOCIAL HISTORY: Patient is single, Jehovah's Witness and a vegetarian.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: He was known to be a well developed, well nourished male. Vital signs were stable and documented in the chart. HEENT: Normocephalic. He had a burn the size of a palm over the apex of

the scalp, there was surrounding singed burned hair, he had a central 25-to 50-cent piece area of deeper burn. The eyes were clear with good visual acuity. The neck was supple without masses. Chest was clear to auscultation and percussion. Heart showed regular sinus rhythm. Abdomen is soft. Extremities show good range of motion. No evidence of other cutaneous burns. GU: Male. Neurological: Oriented times 3. Cranial nerves appear to be intact. No major motor or sensory dysfunction. Deep tendon reflexes 1+ and symmetrical.

ADMISSION LABORATORY DATA: Revealed normal CBC and electrolytes. Previous chest x-ray reviewed at Cedars-Sinai was unremarkable.

HOSPITAL COURSE: The patient was put to bedrest with intermittent bathroom privileges. Silver Sulfadiazine was applied to the scalp along with ice. He was provided analgesics consisting of Percocet 1 every 3 hours prn or Darvocet-N 2 every 3 hours prn. He was given 1/2 cc of Tetanus toxoid as his tetanus toxoid was not currently up to date. A verbal consultation with his treating dermatologist, Arnold Klein, M.D. revealed that the patient has had recent diagnosis of discoid lupus erythematosus with scalp flakiness and previous scalp infection. It was, therefore, suggested that he be changed from penicillin to Ceclor 250 mg tid. In addition, his rheumatologist, Allan Medgers, M.D., suggested he continue on the Plaquenil and Atabrine. Patient was provided with sedation consisting of Dalmane 30 mg hs and had a restful evening. Next morning, he was examined and noted to be quite sleepy. He was initially suggested that he remain in the hospital for few days for rest and recovery. After a shower and a light breakfast, he was noted to be significantly in good spirits and desired discharge in order to rest more comfortably at home in his personal surroundings. His internist, Mark Saginor, M.D. was called to evaluate the patient in view of his desire for discharge and the fact that he complained of hiccups. He was examined with Dr. Saginor and found to be free of any significant medical problems. His burn was small and the discomfort markedly decreased with the previous evening of ice compression. The area was dressed with Silvadene and Hyginet dressing. He was ambulatory and in good spirit after good evening's rest. It was felt that in view of the outpatient size of the burn, his desire to rest more comfortably in his home surroundings and the remarkable nature of his examination other than the hiccups that he be discharged and followed closely on outpatient basis. Therefore, he was discharged to home care. He will be under nursing supervision and my personal supervision on daily basis. His dressing will be changed twice a day consisting of Silvadene and Hyginet

dressing. He will be on Percocet 1 every 3 hours prn or Darvocet-N 100 mg 1 to 2 every 3 hours prn, Ceclor 250 mg tid, Plaquenil 200 mg bid, Atabrine 100 mg qd. He will be washing his hair twice a day, apply Silver Sulfadiazine and a dressing under nursing and medical supervision. He will be in constant supervision from his bodyguards, family and personal business associates along with nursing and medical supervision. The burn will be personally inspected by me on a daily basis. He may require staged excision if any scarring or lack of hair growth occurs and/or hair transplants. This was entirely discussed in detail with him along with his family who understood and desired to proceed and he was, therefore, discharged from the hospital under the above intervening requirements of outpatient care and supervision.


